"Love You Forever"

We Americans pause to give thanks to the Lord for our mothers and all the wonderful women who have mothered us across our lives the second Sunday in May. The first Mother's Day was celebrated seven years earlier when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at Andrew Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia, and was made a national holiday in 1914.

I cannot read the heart-warming little book, "Love You Forever" by Robert Munsch without feeling a lump in the throat and a tear in my eye. Why? I am blessed by an extraordinary Mom!

As you think about the moms in your life, I commend this wonderful "circle of life" story to you.

A mother held her new baby and very slowly rocked him back and forth, back and forth. And while she held him, she sang: I'll love you forever, I'll like you for always, As long as I'm living my baby you'll be.

The baby grew. He grew and he grew and he grew. He grew until he was two years old, and he ran all around the house. He pulled all the books off the shelves. He pulled all the food out of the refrigerator and he took his mother's watch and flushed it down the toilet. Sometimes his mother would say, "this kid is driving me CRAZY!"

But at night time, when that two-year-old was quiet, she opened the door to his room, crawled across the floor, looked up over the side of his bed; and if he was really asleep she picked him up and rocked him back and forth, back and forth, back and forth. While she rocked him she sang: I'll love you forever, I'll like you for always, As long as I'm living my baby you'll be.

The story continues tracing the growth of the boy through the years, then concludes,

Well, that mother, she got older. She got older and older and older. One day she called up her son and said, "You'd better come see me because I'm very old and sick." So her son came to see her. When he came in the door she tried to sing the song. She sang: I'll love you forever, I'll like you for always ...

But she couldn't finish because she was too old and sick. The son went to his mother. He picked her up and rocked her back and forth, back and forth, back and forth. And he sang this song: I'll love you forever, I'll like you for always, As long as I'm living my Mommy you'll be.

When the son came home that night, he stood for a long time at the top of the stairs. Then he went into the room where his very new baby daughter was sleeping. He picked her up in his arms and very slowly rocked her back and forth, back and forth, back and forth. And while he rocked her he sang: I'll love you forever, I'll like you for always, As long as I'm living my baby you'll be.

Re-Opening Plan

Phase 7, effective May 24, 2021, unless otherwise noted.

Considerations

- Troup County is currently in YELLOW (1-15 cases/100,000) which is labeled COMMUNITY SPREAD.
- 3.4 Average 7-day positive cases in Troup County; 17% residents with at least one vaccine; 14% fully vaccinated.
- 65% FUMC Respondents have attended in-person worship in past four weeks; 70% likely to attend in next 4 weeks; 14% somewhat likely to attend in-person; 13% waiting until vaccine more widely distributed.
- As of 4/8/21, Governor Brian Kemp has lifted most large gathering restrictions.
- Staff required to be vaccinated by May 31, unless contrary to religious beliefs or medical orders.
- On-going construction impedes some activities through June 10, especially in Methodist Ministries Center.

Masks

Masks **required** for all persons age 3+ at all indoor gatherings with more than 25 in attendance where social distancing is not possible, except where noted.

Personal Health

If member/guest/staff has any signs or symptoms of COVID-19, he/she should remain off campus. Handwashing and use of hand sanitizer is strongly encouraged.

Worship

- Live Stream & In-Person Worship Services offered at 11 am weekly. Radio broadcast offered weekly.
- Reservations for in-person worship no longer required, beginning with May 30 service.
- Temperatures taken prior to entry.
- Self-monitoring of seating. Participants are encouraged to social distance at least three feet between family units.
- Masks required for all congregants, age 3+. Masks remain in place for entire service.
- Worship leaders and choir no longer required to wear masks, beginning with the May 30 service.
- Communion elements modified.
- Hymnals/Bibles/Guests Pads returned to pews, beginning with the May 30 service.
- Offering plate passed, beginning with the June 13 service.

Staff & Offices

Regular work schedules and office hours. Masks no longer required while in office/work area with 25 or fewer persons in area.

Campus

Signage noting risk of COVID remains in place. Regular cleaning schedule resumes on May 24. Use of spray disinfectant (fogging) no longer in use. Restroom restrictions lifted. Temperature checks required until June 19; day camp excluded.

Weddings & Funerals

- Follow worship protocols for service.
- Outside group protocols apply for receptions and other related gatherings.
- Bride/Groom and Funeral Home required to sign agreement acknowledging current protocols established by church and a waiver, releasing the church of any responsibility of their participants/attendees contracting COVID-19 while on campus.

Sunday School, Small Groups & Committees

- Sunday School classes return to campus and regular schedule, beginning June 20.
- Small groups (less than 25 attendees) return to campus May 10, pending space availability.
- Groups and Sunday School classes must follow mask requirement.



Re-Opening Plan

Phase 7, effective May 24, 2021, unless otherwise noted.

Children & Youth

- Nursery open for worship service, without required reservation, beginning with May 30 service. Toys and equipment disinfected weekly (after use).
- Sunday School classes and Kid's Church resume regular schedule and in regular spaces, beginning June 20. Social distancing of 3 feet strongly encouraged.
- All participants must follow mask requirement.

Day Camp

- Masks required for all participants and staff, regardless of number of participants in each group.
- All campers and staff will be screened prior to entry daily.
- Each camper will have his/her own supply kit.
- All meals (whether provided by family or church) will be boxed.
- Limited interaction between camp classes.
- All seasonal staff required to be vaccinated prior to opening of camp unless violating religious beliefs or medical orders.

Large Groups & Gatherings (25+ attendees)

- Outside groups, including Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts, may return to campus beginning May 10.
 Group leaders must discuss space availability with Executive Minister, due to on-going construction projects and space utilization assessment.
- All groups must sign agreement acknowledging current protocols established by church and a waiver, releasing the church of any responsibility of their participants/attendees contracting COVID-19 while on campus.
- Masks and social distancing will be encouraged; however, groups assume full responsibility for implementation and monitoring.

Food Services

- Soup Kitchen returns to regular operations (non-boxed meals) on June 21.
- TLC & WEW resume in August.
- Coffee stations open June 13.
- Masks required to be worn by all those preparing and/or serving meals.
