

A Message from Dr. John ...

Advent –It's More Than A Season, It's A Lifestyle!

Advent, from the Latin word meaning 'coming,' is the first of seven seasons of time in the Christian calendar. Unlike living *chronos* time, that is, measurable or quantifiable time, it is living *kairos* time, a season or an opportune time — God's time.

The watchword for Advent is the cry of the Prophet Isaiah:

"¹Comfort, yes, comfort My people!' says your God. ²Speak comfort to Jerusalem, and cry out to her, that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned; for she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.' ³The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God'" (Isaiah 40:1-3).

This cry is the opening word of the Gospel:

"¹The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. ²As it is written in the Prophets: 'Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, who will prepare Your way before You.' ³The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make His paths straight'" (Mark 1:1-3).

We are called to Prepare the Way for the Lord every day. But how?

My greatest period of spiritual growth came as a college undergraduate. While at Baylor University, and actively involved at The First United Methodist Church of Waco, Texas, I learned the irreplaceable spiritual discipline of having a consistent, daily **Quiet Time** with the Lord. I learned how, every morning, to prepare the way for the Lord to work in and through my life that day, by making uninterrupted time for Him, listening to His voice through the Bible and the Holy Spirit, and offering myself to Him.

This daily practice remains my source of confident trust as I begin each day ready to expect the unexpected knowing that He is always with me.

As we journey through this Advent 2020 together, and approach a new year, I challenge you to commit to a daily Quiet Time with the Lord and see what great calm and confidence He works in your life, especially in these challenging times.

May I suggest using my new favorite experiential devotional guide? Lectio 365 is a daily devotional resource that helps me encounter God and shapes my life by praying the Bible every day.

Lectio 365 is a smartphone app that guides me by the spoken word and meditative music. Each day's devotional experience runs between 8 and 10 minutes and is presented by world Christians whose accents represent the United Kingdom, the United States, and the continent of Africa.

Lectio 365, inspired by *Lectio Divina*, Latin words meaning 'divine reading,' is a way of meditating on the Bible that has been used by Christians for centuries. Each day I read the same passage twice and discover that God is speaking through it.

Lectio 365 guides me to PRAY. 'P': PAUSE to be still. 'R': REJOICE with a Psalm and REFLECT on a Bible passage. 'A': ASK God to help me and others. And 'Y': YIELD to His will in my life.

Throughout the year, Lectio 365 journeys through six practices that help us shape life around the **three great loves** at the heart of Christianity. Discover how to love God through **prayer and creativity** (Matthew 22:37), love one another through **justice and hospitality** (Matthew 22:39), and love the world through **learning and mission** (Matthew 28:18–20).

Truly, Lectio 365 is a most impactful devotional practice!

I also recommend two other devotional guides that have richly encouraged my spiritual journey. First, the timeless "*My Utmost for His Highest*" by Oswald Chambers, now available in both classic language and contemporary language in print form and as a smartphone app. And second, "Jesus Calling" by Sarah Young, available in print form and as a smartphone app.
