Jacob Rogers receives Henderson Traylor Eagle Scout Scholarship

Jacob Rogers has been honored with the \$1,500 **Henderson Traylor Eagle Scout Scholarship**. Jacob is the son of **Jeff and Rhonda Rogers** and has an older brother, **Chase**. A standout on the LaGrange High School soccer team, he is heading to the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa this fall and plans to major in mechanical engineering.

The Boy Scouts of America issued a charter to the First Methodist Church of LaGrange in 1927 to establish Troop 21, and since that time, over 100 boys have earned the prestigious Eagle Scout Award. Mr. Henderson Traylor joined this new Troop as a young boy and became one of its first two Eagle Scouts in 1936.

Mr. Traylor worked for the Boy Scouts as a district executive before serving at the Pentagon. After returning home from military service, he joined his uncle at Hutchinson Traylor Insurance Company. He served as the Scoutmaster for Troop 21 in 1947. His son, **Tom Traylor**, earned his Eagle Scout award in 1967, and then two grandsons earned their Eagle Scout Award some years later. As a tribute to Mr. Traylor, who was a lifelong supporter and leader in both the church and Troop 21, a scholarship in his name was established in 2009 to be awarded to an outstanding Eagle Scout from Troop 21.

Congratulations, Jacob! We are so proud of you for earning the Eagle Scout award and the scholarship to commemorate Mr. Traylor's service to Troop 21 and LaGrange First Methodist.

CONGRATS, CLASS OF 2021!

During our May 23 worship service, we celebrated Graduate Sunday, a time when we honor our high school graduates who are a part of the LaGrange First Methodist family of faith. We marvel at who each of them has become as they have developed meaningful friendships, shaped our church's youth group, worked long hours in school, and strengthened their individuality through other endeavors, including dance, soccer, music, track and cross-country, art, and drama.

May 23 also was Pentecost Sunday, and it is fitting the Pentecost story is one of graduation and commencement. As Jesus's disciples huddled together in the Upper Room after His death and Resurrection, He came back to them and basically said, "Class is dismissed. We have such deep love and pride in honoring you! We have watched many of you grow as we rocked you to sleep in the nursery, acted out stories of Jesus with you, fed you on the playground, or mentored you in a small group.

We pray God keeps you in His care as you embark on the next chapter of your faith journey—beyond the walls of our church and the comfort of our community. We ask God to sustain you with understanding, grace, and forgiveness as you move forward to face the challenges and joys that will shape you. As you step out into the world, we pray for God to light your path and guard your hearts. We love you and are so proud of you!


