## from your senior minister... A MESSAGE OF GRATITUDE

There is nothing quite like the feeling ... driving through a new landscape for the first time, looking at a piece of art, reading a book that changes your perspective, listening to a song whose melody strikes a chord in your heart. I was inspired on Sunday morning when our **Modern Worship** service launched at LaGrange First Methodist at the end of October. Our Evangelism Team developed this program in 2012, under the direction of **Jake Behr**, as an opportunity for those from our traditional and modern services and the communityat-large to gather together to sing, pray, and give thanks for all the blessings God has bestowed upon us as individuals and as a church.

Bring your child's unwrapped gifts to the Broad Street entrance of the Children's Building (press the door buzzer and then leave them just inside the door next to the stairwell) between Monday, November 29, and Tuesday, December 7. The Salvation Army will pick up all the gifts at the church on Wednesday morning, December 8.

Students currently in grades six to 12 may register; the trip costs \$400 per student and can be paid in installments. #### **New Sunday Morning Schedule**

This is an exciting time in the life of our church! On October 31, we launched our new modern worship service! With the addition of this service, we now offer children's programming from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm. We look forward to welcoming new families and seek to make their experience at First Methodist one of excellence in all areas.

To this end, we will offer Children's Church the first and third hour with Sunday School during the middle hour. For a new family, we have 10 minutes to make that first impression, from the parking lot to check-in at the Children's Building. Parents worry about their child's safety, and having their child walk out in the middle of the service with a stranger to an unknown location could be worrisome.

For this reason, all children will be checked in by their parent or guardian at the Vernon Street entrance to the Children's building where they will be greeted by someone who can assist them. Children will then either participate in Children's Church or Sunday School activities. Children will stay in the Children's Building until the parent comes to check them out.

We recognize the importance of families worshipping together. Therefore, on the first Sunday of each month. children will worship together with their families at the Modern Worship or Traditional service. Sunday School for children will be from 10:00 - 10:45 am. Our nursery for young children will be available each Sunday of the month from 8:45 am - 12:15 pm.

#### **Wednesday Night Kids**

We have been learning about the fruit of the Spirit and putting it into action. This month we have continued working in our thankfulness journals on a daily basis, completed a kindness bingo challenge and served others at our Reverse Trick-or-Treat.
